SECTION 4: First aid measures

4.1 Description of first aid measures

General information:	If medical advice is needed, have product container or label at hand. Take off contaminated clothing and wash it before reuse.
In case of inhalation:	Remove casualty to fresh air and keep warm and at rest. In case of respiratory tract irritation, consult a physician.
Following skin contact:	Immediately clean with water and soap followed by thorough rinsing. In case of skin reactions, consult a physician.
After eye contact:	Immediately flush eyes with plenty of flowing water for 10 to 15 minutes holding eyelids apart. Remove contact lenses, if present and easy to do. Continue rinsing. Subsequently consult an ophthalmologist.



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After swallowing: Rinse mouth immediately and drink plenty of water. Never give anything by mouth to an unconscious person. Do not induce vomiting. Caution if victim vomits: Risk of aspiration! Keep airway open. Immediately get medical attention.

4.2 Most important symptoms and effects, both acute and delayed

May be fatal if swallowed and enters airways.
The following symptoms may occur: Cough, respiratory complaints, shortage of breath, fever, pulmonary oedema, pneumonia. Symptoms can occur only after several hours.

4.3 Indication of any immediate medical attention and special treatment needed

Treat symptomatically. Aspiration hazard: in case of swallowing or vomiting danger of penetration into the lungs.

SECTION 5: Firefighting measures

5.1 Extinguishing media

Suitable extinguishing media:

Water spray jet, extinguishing powder, foam, carbon dioxide.

Extinguishing media which must not be used for safety reasons:

Full water jet.

5.2 Special hazards arising from the substance or mixture

Combustible. May form dangerous gases and vapours in case of fire.
Furthermore, there may develop: smoke, nitrogen oxides (NO_x), carbon monoxide and carbon dioxide.

5.3 Advice for firefighters

Special protective equipment for firefighters:

Wear self-contained positive pressure breathing apparatus and full firefighting protective clothing.

Additional information:

Do not inhale explosion and combustion gases. Use fine water spray to cool endangered containers. Move undamaged containers from immediate hazard area if it can be done safely.

Contaminated fire-fighting water must be collected separately. Do not allow water used to extinguish fire to enter drains, ground or waterways.

Fire residuals and contaminated extinguishing water must be disposed of in accordance with the regulations of the local authorities.

SECTION 6: Accidental release measures

6.1 Personal precautions, protective equipment and emergency procedures

Do not breathe mist/vapours/spray. Avoid oil mist formation. Provide adequate ventilation. If possible, eliminate leakage.

Do not get in eyes, on skin, or on clothing. Take off contaminated clothing and wash it before reuse.

Wear appropriate protective equipment. Keep unprotected people away.

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6.3 Methods and material for containment and cleaning up

Wipe up with absorbent material (eg. cloth, fleece). Absorb with liquid-binding material (e.g. sand, diatomaceous earth, acid- or universal binding agents) and place in closed containers for disposal. Prevent spread over a wide area (e.g. by containment or oil barriers). Never return spills in original containers for re-use. Clean contaminated articles and floor according to the environmental legislation.

7.1 Precautions for safe handling
