SECTION 4: First aid measures

4.1 Description of first aid measures

General information:	In all cases of doubt, or when symptoms persist, seek medical advice. If medical advice is needed, have product container or label at hand. Take off contaminated clothing and wash it before reuse.
In case of inhalation:	Remove casualty to fresh air and keep warm and at rest. Where appropriate artificial ventilation. In case of respiratory tract irritation, consult a physician.
Following skin contact:	Immediately clean with water and soap followed by thorough rinsing. In case of skin reactions, consult a physician.
After eye contact:	Immediately flush eyes with plenty of flowing water for 10 to 15 minutes holding eyelids apart. Remove contact lenses, if present and easy to do. Continue rinsing. In case of eye irritation consult an ophthalmologist.
After swallowing:	Do NOT induce vomiting. Rinse mouth with water. Never give anything by mouth to an unconscious person. Where appropriate artificial ventilation. Seek medical attention. Observe risk of aspiration if vomiting occurs.



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4.2 Most important symptoms and effects, both acute and delayed

The following symptoms may occur: Cough, respiratory complaints, shortage of breath, fever, vomiting, pneumonia.

Symptoms can occur only after several hours.

May be fatal if swallowed and enters airways.

SECTION 5: Firefighting measures

5.1 Extinguishing media

Suitable extinguishing media:

5.2 Special hazards arising from the substance or mixture

Stop leak if safe to do so.

SECTION 7: Handling and storage

7.1 Precautions for safe handling

Advices on safe handling: Provide adequate ventilation, and local exhaust as needed.
Provide earthing of containers, equipment, pumps and ventilation facilities.
Put lids on containers immediately after use. Wear appropriate protective equipment.
Avoid breathing mist/vapours/spray.
Do not eat, drink or smoke when using this product. Wash hands thoroughly after handling. Take off contaminated clothing and wash it before reuse.
Have eye wash bottle or eye rinse ready at work place.
Use only antistatically equipped (spark-free) tools.

Precautions against fire and explosion:

Keep away from heat, hot surfaces, sparks, open flames and other ignition sources. No smoking. Take precautionary measures against static discharge. The vapour is heavier than air and may travel along the ground; distant ignition possible.
