### 4.1 Description of first aid measures

- In case of inhalation: If breathing is difficult, remove victim to fresh air and keep at rest in a position comfortable for breathing. Seek medical attention if problems persist.
- Following skin contact: Remove residues with soap and water. Take off contaminated clothing and wash it before reuse. In case of skin reactions, consult a physician.

### 7.1 Precautions for safe handling
